STANDARD AND SMALL-SCALE PROJECTS

The specific rules applicable for small-scale projects are highlighted in the different manuals and are summarised in a dedicated factsheet.

SMALL-SCALE PROJECTS

PARTNERSHIP

- At least one Austrian and one Hungarian partner
- Overall maximum 3 partners
- Adding **strategic partners** to the partnership is **not** allowed
- Possible beneficiaries: partners located in programme area and and/or such that have legally defined competences or field of function for certain parts of the area.



BUDGET

- Project size (total budget) must be between **25 000-200 000 €**
- Extensive use of simplified cost options (**SCOs**)



TIME-PLAN

Maximum project duration is 18 months



ACTIVITIES

- Organised in **one work package**
- Only activities with a cross-border impact (**no one-time actions** in only one direction of the border) e.g. preparations for digital processes, training, seminars and courses, cooperation between microregions, municipalities, schools, sports clubs, organisation and realisation of summer schools, cross border events, etc.
- No investment in infrastructure and work


