

INTERVENTION LOGIC

Projects must realistically and successfully contribute to the achievement of programme targets. Therefore, it is important for applicants to understand the intervention logic of the Programme and design their projects in compliance with it.

In this factsheet, the intervention logic is broken down into its single elements to help a better understanding and the development of a proper project intervention logic.

(The factsheet does not substitute thorough consulting of the Application Manual and the Indicator Manual.)



Project overall objective = The project's strategic target



Project specific objectives = Concrete targets by work package



Project results = Changes achieved by the project, measured by programme result indicators



Project outputs = Overarching outcomes of the activities, measured by programme output indicators



Work packages = Group of closely linked project activities to achieve a project specific objective



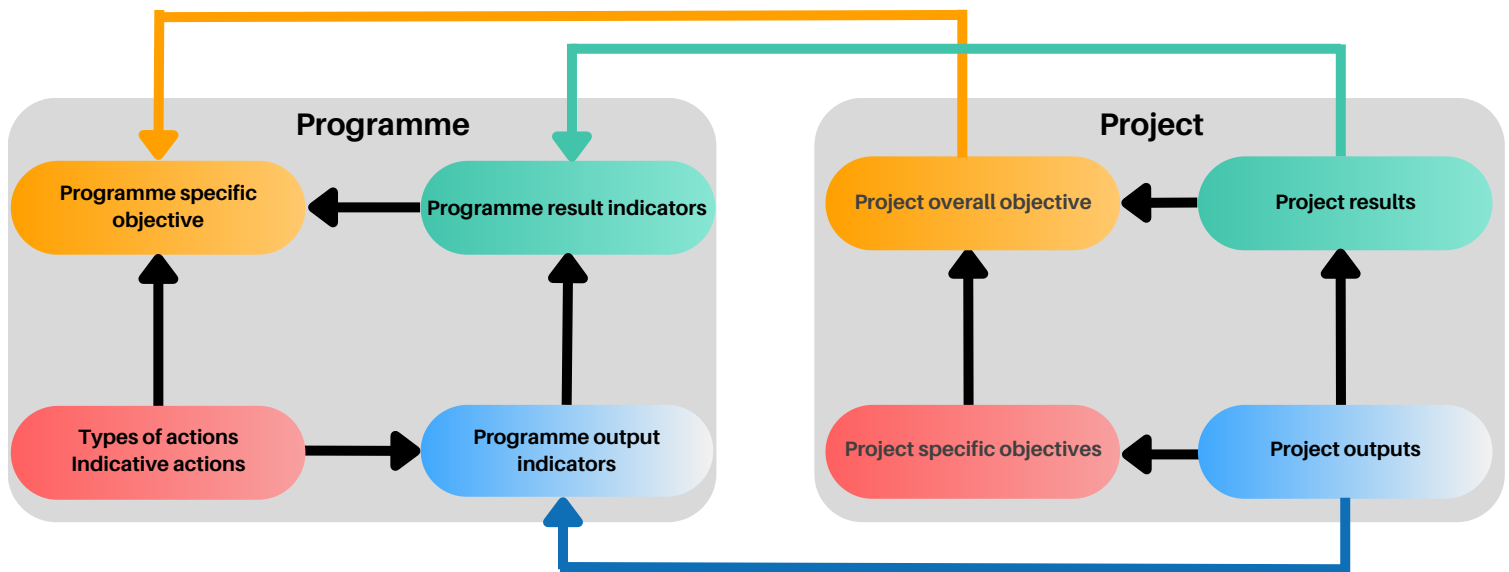
Activities = Tasks financed by the programme, implemented with the target to produce deliverables. Closely linked activities form a work package.



Deliverables = Direct outcomes of the activities that are not measured by programme output indicators



INTERVENTION LOGIC



While setting up the targets of your project, check the followings:

Within the project:

- the project specific objective(s) of each work package are clear, realistic and achievable, they support the achievement of the project overall objective
- the project outputs represent important achievements of the project and of the work package concerned, they contribute to the work package's specific objective
- the project outputs and project results are realistic

Between the project and the programme:

- the project overall objective clearly contributes to the achievement of the programme priority specific objective
- the project outputs make clear and sufficient contribution to programme output indicators
- the project makes clear and sufficient contribution to the achievement of programme result indicators

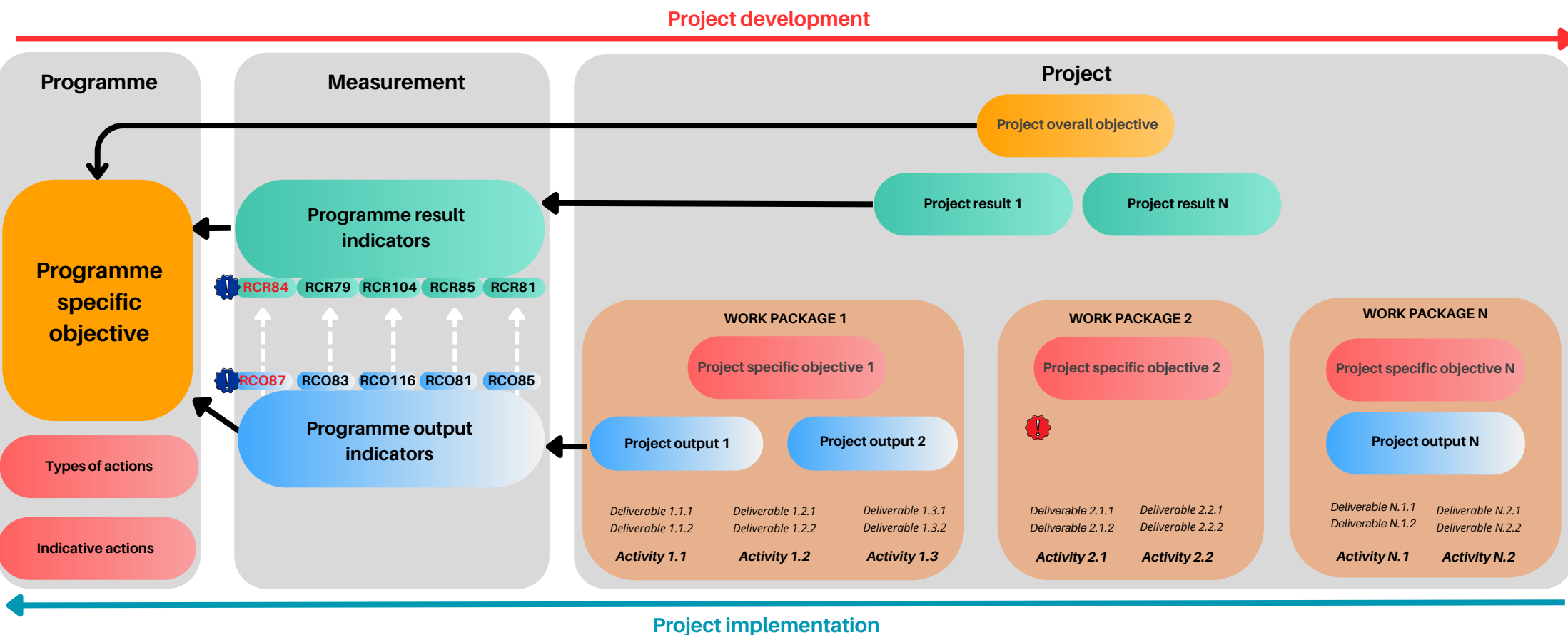
On the next chart you can see the structure of the project's intervention logic and all the links among the elements of the programme and project intervention logic.

- Outputs are linked to the work packages. At least one output must be defined in each project, but it is not necessary for each work package to have an output.
