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### 1 Introduction

In the process of programming Interreg AT-HU 2021-2027, in line with regulatory requirements laid down in the draft common provisions regulation, the programme involved relevant national, regional and local stakeholders. 220 stakeholders were involved in the Online Survey.

A consultation process was launched in November 2020, which built on thematic discussions and preliminary decisions taken by the Programming Group Members in two Programming Group meetings. The aim was to collect feedback on an early draft version of the future Interreg Programme, which already indicated possible future programme priorities, selected specific objectives, horizontal topics as well as relevant fields of action.

The stakeholders were invited to provide their feedback in an Online Survey, which was open between November 12<sup>th</sup> and November 26<sup>th</sup>. The survey focused primarily on quantitative feedback about the relevance of the priorities and possible fields of activity per Specific Objective (SO). In addition, respondents could include qualitative inputs (the questionnaire template is enclosed as Annex 1).


This report documents the outcomes of the stakeholder survey, being a valuable source of information for further fine-tuning the programme strategy and for drafting the programme intervention logic in the IP draft version. For the time being, the comments submitted by the participants are listed as a loose collection (this applies to chapter 3 Thematic concentration, subtopic "general comments", chapters 3.1 to 3.4 subtopics "comments on the proposed fields of action" and "Focus on specific geographical area in the AT-HU border region" as well as on chapter 3.5 Additional comments and activities proposed).

The comments were discussed in the frame of two online stakeholder workshops (Feb 1<sup>st</sup> 2021 with Hungarian stakeholders and Feb 16<sup>th</sup> with Austrian stakeholders). All comments received in the public consultation and the stakeholder workshops have been compiled in a list of comments that also contains information on which source the comment has been received and how it was considered in the programming process.


The outcomes of the stakeholder consultation were also integrated in a consolidated way in the report on the Strategic Thematic Directions as well as in the Programme Draft.

### 2 General Information

In total, 220 persons¹ participated in the online survey coming from Burgenland (41), Wien (38), Niederösterreich (34), Győr-Moson-Sopron (28), Steiermark (27), Vas (26), Zala (16), Budapest (8) and others (3).




The most represented **types of institution** were local, regional or national public authorities (81), institutions for higher education and research (40), interest groups including NGOs (35) and sectoral agencies (22).




156 participants (71 %) have already been involved in an **Interreg AT-HU project**.

# 3 Thematic concentration

# Relevance of priorities and selected specific objectives

The participants agreed to a large extent with the proposed priorities and selected specific objectives; 91 % up to 96 % agreed or tended to agree to the proposal. The highest agreement was with priority 1 (81 % fully agreed) and priority 3 (73 %) followed by priority 2 (68 %) and priority 4 (64 %).




### 3.1 Priority 1: a resilient and green border area

### Promoting climate change adaptation, risk prevention and disaster resilience

**88 participants (40 %)** commented in the online survey on the specific objective of "climate change adaption and risk prevention, including also horizontal activities regarding digitisation, R&I, SME competitiveness and smart specialisation". Rest of the participants did not make any comment to this objective.



The overall approval to the proposed fields of activity was very high among the ones who commented, ranging from 91 % to 92 % of the participants rating them as (very) relevant - with the exception of "Greening the economy, having an overall approval of 82 %. "Bridging the gap between climate research and practical implementation" was rated as the most relevant field of activity (73 % assessed it as very relevant, 19 % as relevant), followed by "fostering climate resilient cities and communities" (60 %; 31 %), "supporting risk prevention and disaster resilience of natural hazards" (55 %; 36 %) and "greening the economy" (48 %; 34 %).





# **Promoting sustainable water management**

**62 participants (28 %)** commented in the online survey on the specific objective "Promoting sustainable water management".



"Protecting common surface, thermal and ground water bodies" was rated as the most relevant field of activity (69 % assessed it as very relevant, 26 % as relevant, altogether 95% in these two categories). At a similar level of approval ranks "Promoting sustainable use of water resources" (66 %; 29%, altogether 95%), whereas "Supporting joint flood monitoring, forecast and protection" is considered as not as relevant with a total approval rate of 81 % (55 % very relevant; 26 % relevant).







# Enhancing biodiversity, green infrastructure in the urban environment, and reducing pollution

**101 participants (46 %)** commented in the online survey on the specific objective of "Enhancing biodiversity, green infrastructure in the urban environment, and reducing pollution".



"Integrating biodiversity into other sectors" was rated as the most relevant field of activity: 75 % assessed it as very relevant, 21 % as relevant. This is also the highest level of approval among all fields of activities mentioned in this consultation. At a very similar level of approval ranks "Fostering knowledge acquisition, transfer and awareness raising on nature protection, biodiversity and related ecosystem services" (73 %; 21 %), whereas "Preserving and restoring biodiversity in sensitive areas, improving the cross-border connectivity" is considered as not as relevant, as a direct comparison shows (64%; 29 %).




# 3.2 Priority 2: a connected border area

Developing sustainable, climate resilient, intelligent and intermodal national, regional and local mobility, including improved access to TEN-T and cross-border mobility

**97 participants (44 %)** commented in the online survey on the specific objective of "Developing sustainable, climate resilient, intelligent and intermodal national, regional and local mobility, including improved access to TEN-T and cross-border mobility".



"Fostering knowledge and awareness on smart and sustainable mobility on local level" was rated as the most relevant field of activity (71 % assessed it as very relevant, 25 % as relevant). "Closing gaps in sustainable mobility infrastructure" (67 %; 22 %) and "Enhancing sustainable cross-border mobility services" (65 %; 27 %) seem to be a little less relevant to the participants.




# 3.3 Priority 3: a competent border area

Improving access to and the quality of education, training and lifelong learning across borders with a view to increasing the educational attainment and skills levels thereof as to be recognised across borders

**118 participants (54 %)** commented in the online survey on the specific objective of "Improving access to and the quality of education, training and lifelong learning across borders with a view to increasing the educational attainment and skills levels thereof as to be recognised across borders".



Both fields of activity were rated as relevant or very relevant by more than 90 % of the participants. "Supporting harmonisation of the vocational training" receives the highest undivided approval; 63 % rated it as very relevant. However, "Fostering language and cultural competences" has slightly more positive votes in total (93 %); it is considered as very relevant by 58 % of the participants.

**109 participants (50 %)** commented in the online survey on the "Interreg specific objective - Institutional capacity of public authorities, Legal and administrative cooperation and cooperation between citizens and institutions, People-to-people actions for increased trust".



The overall approvement of the proposed fields of activity ranks between 84 % and 89 %. "Improving the regions digital connectivity by making comparable cross-border data or data on cross-border interaction available" is ranked number one in fields of relevance in this specific objective. 60 % of the participants assessed it as very relevant, 29 % as relevant, none as not relevant at all. This is followed by "Reconstructing tourism after the COVID-19 pandemic as a good basis for cross-border cooperation" considering the approval rate (59 %; 25 %). "Fostering SME competitiveness and smart specialisation focusing on intermediary institutions" and "Intensifying cooperation in health care and long-term care services" were rated almost equally (52 %; 35 % and 52 %; 33 %) in midfield. "Fostering

labour market by focusing on reducing legal or administrative obstacles" is considered as "very relevant" by 50 % of the participants, and as "relevant" for another 36 %.

Promoting climate change adaptation, risk prevention and disaster resilience

① Due to climate change, Central Europe will face an increase in heat extremes and decrease in summer precipitation, leading to an increasing risk of river floods and forest fires, as well as to a decrease in economic value of forests and increase in energy demand for cooling. The **regions in the border area will face similar challenges**, since large parts of them are situated in the Pannonian climate province, being overall warm and dry (annual precipitation 550-700 mm) and characterized by large seasonal differences and extreme values - hot summers and cold winters with little snow and low groundwater recharge.

The AT-HU cross-border area is assessed as having a medium to high environmental sensitivity to climate change. The impact of climate change in the AT-HU border region is already perceivable in many ways and will be a huge challenge for the region's ecosystems, its population and its economy in the next decades. Immediate action is required to meet these challenges.

Promoting sustainable water management ① The cross-border cooperation in management of the common water bodies is determined by the EU Water Framework Directive (WFD) and the EU Floods Directive and very well developed via the permanent Austro-Hungarian Water Commission. A range of cross-border projects are successfully implemented via the former (joint) cross-border programmes, including INTERREG AT-HU 2014-2020, building a solid base of knowledge in a variety of water management issues and a common understanding of possible measures. In the future, cooperation is essential for further improve the understanding of the water systems, implementing measures especially on groundwater protection, flood and sediment control, risk management and sustainable water management, and to specifically prepare for climate change impacts (including extreme events) preferably by mutually beneficial measures with EU WFD. Enhancing biodiversity, green infrastructure in the urban environment, and reducing pollution ① The joint management of large protected areas or biotope network systems is quite established in the programme area and will become increasingly important in the future regarding the resilience of habitats. Ongoing land consumption and pressure of use due to the region's economic development caused by housing development, the construction of roads or tourism projects – additionally fired by climate change – bears increasing risks of habitat fragmentation, loss of biodiversity and reduced ecosystem services.

Thus, in order to keep up the resilience of the habitats, there is a need to focus on improving the cross-border connectivity of protected areas and biotopes by establishing cross-border migration corridors and additional stepping stone biotopes helping to connect areas of habitat, allowing (endangered) species move between them and to engage in genetic exchange as well as improving the permeability of migration barriers (rail, road, weirs). Also, climate change has a specific impact on eco-systems by changing the composition of fauna and flora, shifting the vegetation cycles and favouring pests. There is a need of knowledge-generation and exchange on neobiota (new animal and plant species) in the programme area, their influence on both protected and unprotected habitats and the related ecosystem services and possible measures to conserve biodiversity and species protection.

Developing sustainable, climate resilient, intelligent and intermodal national, ① Cross-border commuting and other forms of economically based cross-border relations have become increasingly relevant in the last years in the border area. Labour mobility is considerable even in European comparison: more than 20.000 employees are daily commuters from the Hungarian counties mostly to Burgenland, Vienna and Graz with increasing tendency, typically travelling five times a week. Traffic generated by tourism shows an increasing trend, too, however, domestic tourism is more dominant in both countries. Increase of cross-border tourism, however, can be considered as important development potential for the region's tourism industry. Due to clear gaps in terms of intraregional and cross-border accessibility in public transport, individual motorized traffic is becoming the predominant mode in travels crossing the border. ① Language barriers and still existing cultural differences in most of the segments of the population are the main obstacle of deepening cooperation in the border region. Intercultural learning approaches rank among the most effective ones to address these barriers and the existing prejudices and to foster changes of perspective and mindset of people, having little attention at national level.

Additionally, labour market and employment issues have strong cross-border relevance mainly because a great quantity of Hungarian workforce commuting to Austrian workplaces. However, the risks of changes in this field, due to unforeseeable consequences of the COVID pandemic, threaten the previously good absorption capacity of direct interventions. Thus, labour market issues have been chosen rather to be addressed indirectly, mainly through the coordinated development of the training capacities of the programme region. In the field of vocational training, further training, higher education diplomas, joint development and mutual recognition of qualifications could best enhance the effectiveness of the labour market. Provision of accessible high-quality education could narrow the gap in terms of attractive-ness of these concentrated hubs and the rest of the region (smaller towns, rural areas), contributing to the increased competitiveness of the border region, as a whole.
